Week One: Growing June 15-17

We'll plant seeds and follow their growth throughout camp. We'll explore mud and dirt, measure, document and more. We'll compare how things grow with how we grow personally.

Week Two: Numbers June 20-22

Numbers: Donald Crews' book Ten Black Dots and the poem Tumble Rumble by Stephanie Calmansen will inspire activities for building, counting, labeling, predicting and more.

Week Three: Moving June 27-29

We'll make our own predictive reading books following the format of the story *On the Go by Rozanne Lanczank Williams. Bus art will give us opportunities to create individual stories.

Week Four: Outdoor Fun July 13-15

Mrs. McNosh Hangs up Her Wash by Sarah Weeks will increase awareness of rhyme. We will follow the stories lead as we explore water through washing clothes outside, bubble art prints, and more.

Week Five: Bears July 20-22

Each child's personal bear will help us compare and contrast, seriate and tell stories. We'll also create a special blanket for our bears that are sure to enhance our storytelling and dramatic play..
